THE RAMAYANA made a surprise entry amid the high-octane speech of Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Rajya Sabha. And hours later, BJP's IT wing head Amit Malviya filled in the blanks. While the Prime Minister was arguing that the Aadhaar scheme was conceptualised by the A B Vajpayee government, Congress member Renuka Chowdhury laughed out hysterically. As Chairman M Venkaiah Naidu pulled her up for her conduct and told her that he may have to name her, Modi requested him not to say anything to her. He said he heard such laughter for the first time after the Ramayan serial telecast on Indian television in the late 80s. Hours later, Malviyatweeted a clip of Surpanakha laughing out loud from the serial with a comment: "Someone sent methis video clip from Ramayana in response to 'identify the laughter' contest... Can you identify her?"

SMASHING DEBUT

MANY OF the Congress members, who spoke during the debate on the President's Address in Rajya Sabha, may have been disappointed by what they saw on Wednesday when Sanjay Singh, the newly elected AAP MP, was speaking. Members of their party and other opposition members thumped the desks and cheered loudly as Singh tore into the BJP. None of the Congress speakers got such loud applause and support. Congress's Pramod Tiwari, who was sitting in the second row, moved to the backbenches to cheer Singh. When the BJP members disrupted Singh, the entire Congress rose up in unison and shouted them down. They made Singh's maiden speech memorable for him, encouraging him to say more. They even argued with the Chair when he asked him to sit down after completion of the 15 minutes allocated to him. When Singh finally ended his speech, Tiwari walked up to him to congratulate him. The new-found AAP-Congress bonhomie in Parliament will surely not be to Delhi Congress chief Ajay Maken's liking,

Slogan-shouting Andhra MPs test Chair's patience, force disruptions in Rajya Sabha

THERE WAS high drama in Rajya Sabha on Wednesday after TDP MPCM Ramesh, who was raising slogans standing in the Well, refused to leave the House even after Deputy Chairman P I Kurien, invoking Rule 255, asked him to leave. Marshals had to be called in to escort Ramesh out of the House. Earlier in the day. Chairman M Venkaiah Naiduinvoked the same rule against a Congress member from Andhra Pradesh.

Narendra Modi replied to the motion of thanks on the President's Address and the House passed the motion, Kurien Congress's Chidambaram to initiate the discussion on the union budget.

As soon as Prime Minister

Simultaneously, Ramesh and couple of his party colleagues raised the issue of non-implementation of the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014.

They moved to the Well raising slogans even as Kurien asked them to take their seats. With Ramesh not paying heed to his request, the Deputy Chairman said he will have to invoke Rule 255 and direct him to withdraw from the House. Leader of the Opposition Ghulam Nabi Azad said the Congress had supported the Chairman when he named hispartyMPKVPRamachandra Rao earlier in the day and asked Kurien to invoke Rule 255.

After repeated warnings, Kurien finally invoked the rule and asked Ramesh to withdraw but he refused to comply and stood in the Well shouting slogans, Kurien then asked the marshals to escort Rameshout.

As the marshals walked in and persuaded Ramesh to move out of the House, Kurien adjourned the House for 15 minutes. Senior union ministers and BJP MPs then intervened and asked the marshals to leave Ramesh. The TDP member did

not leave the House and continued standing in the Well and shouting slogans when the House reassembled.

As Kurien watched in surprise, Trinamool Congress floor leader Derek O Brien said since Rule 255 has been invoked, "they should be out of here, why are they disturbing the House... where are the marshals". Kurien then told Ramesh: "I have named you, if you have any respect to Parliamentary democracy you go."


"It is a shame," Kurien said and adjourned the House for another 10 minutes, saying he cannot continue the House if the person who he named continued to stand in the House. When the House reconvened after 10 minutes, Ramesh continued his slogan shouting prompting Kurien to adjourn the House for the day, saying he was doing so as he did not want to precipitate any ugly scenes in the House by enforcing his direction.

Earlier in the day, an upset Naidu said he would not run the House if Rao continued standing in the Well holding aloft a placard. He asked Azad to call him back to his seat but, minus a short statement about how his party did not support Rao's conduct, Azad did not comply. Naidu said: "I have only two options, name him or adjourn."

When Rao did not go back to his seat, Naidu named him under Rule 255, which requires the member thus named to withdraw from the House for the day.

However, Naidu was lenient. He told Rao that he could either withdraw from the House or go back to his seat. As his party colleagues started gesturing to him to return to his seat, Rao complied.

There was much exchange of words in the House when Naidu disallowing a notice under Rule 267 from Akali Dal MP Sukhdev Singh Dhindsa allowed him to table and speak on an alleged CD in which a Congress leader is heard claiming to have killed 100 Sikhs in the aftermath of the killing of then prime minister Indira Gandhi in 1984.

Oppn divided, amendment defeated in Rajya Sabha

THE IDEA was to embarrass the government, but the Opposition on Wednesday was left red-faced in Rajya Sabha, where it has an upper hand numerically, as an amendment moved by one of the parties to the President's Address was defeated 86-57. The episode also exposed the chinks in the Opposition ranks as the Samajwadi Party openly opposed pressing the amendment on the issue

of the women's reservation Bill. Twice in the past three years, the Opposition had embarrassed the government by passing amendments to the President's Address. Although Opposition members had moved 324 amendments this time, almost all the amendments were withdrawn on the floor of the House

or negatived in a voice vote. CPM's T K Rangarajan, however, demanded a division on his amendment. He wanted to insert - "but regret that there is no mention in the Address about the government's failure to pass Women's Reservation Bill".

Finance Minister and Leader of the House Arun Jaitley tried to persuade Rangarajan not to press for division, assuring him that the government would try to evolve a consensus on the Women's Reservation Bill, which was passed by Rajya Sabhain 2010 but is yet to be taken up in Lok Sabha.

"In principle most members of the House do not have any difficulty in accepting the suggestion. And therefore, let me assure... we will try and call a meeting of all political parties and try and evolve a consensus..." Jaitley said. But Rangarajan disagreed, saying, "We have sufficiently waited but only after putting this amendment the government is saying we will create a consensus."

Exposing the chinks in the Opposition ranks, SP member Naresh Agrawal said there was

in the President's Address the line no need for a vote since the House has already passed the women's reservation Bill.

"Why a vote is being demanded... Why there is voting... because some people want to derive political benefit out of it... they want to give it a political colour ... those who have destroyed the country... are now giving political colour to it... I am not in favour of it. The Bill has already been passed by this House. There is no such tradition," Agrawal said. The SP,RJDtheJD(U) had opposed the Bill when it was passed in Rajya

Sabha in March 2010. The Congress, whose government had passed the women's reservation Bill in Rajya Sabha, had no option but to vote with the Left members despite knowing that the Opposition benches were not in full strength and some of them are not on the same page. The Trinamool Congress members were not present in the House as they had staged a walk out earlier. There were not many members of the DMK and the BSP.

Moily demands white paper on Rafale deal

FORMER UNION minister and seniorCongress leader Veerappa Moily on Wednesday demanded that the government issue a white paper on the Rafale deal and Prime Minister Narendra Modi apologise for casting "aspersions on the behaviour of Mahatma Gandhi". He was initiating the discussion on the Union Budget in the Lok Sabha.

Moily dubbed the Rafale aircraft deal "the biggest scam" of the Modi government and said the Prime Minister was answerable to the people on the issue. There was "a complete nontransparency in the Rafale deal, non-disclosure of purchase price of these aircraft, and a violation of mandatory provision of defence procurement procedure".

He said, "Tragically, the Defence Minister (Nirmala Sitharaman) has finally refused to disclose the purchase price (of the aircraft) in Parliament. What does it say?... the deal has left more questions than answers. Time for the Prime Minister to answer the questions to the people of this country in Parliament."

He said during the UPA rule, the price negotiation was on Rs 586.1 crore per aircraft, but the price negotiated by the present government was Rs 1,570.8 crore as per the current exchange rate. "Who is responsible for the loss to the exchequer?", he asked, alleging the government was "playing with the security of the nation". He said, "They (the government) are not interested in (the appointment of) Lokpal because they know this deal would be the first matter that will go to the ombudsman."

He demanded an apology from the Prime Minister over his claim that Sardal Patel was ignored for prime ministership despite the fact that the majority of Congress units had backed him over Jawaharlal Nehru. Thus, he felt, Modi had cast an aspersion on Mahatma Gandhi.

He also claimed Finance Minister Arun Jaitley had not been allowed to function inde-

pendently to give a better Budget. MostBJP members, prompted by Parliamentary Affairs Minister Ananth Kumar and party chief whip Rakesh Singh, got up to disrupt Moily's speech.

Ananth Kumar said the BJP members were agitated following slogan-shouting by the Congress during the Prime Minister's speech.

Oppn targets govt on inequality, other issues

COURTS ARE responsible for administration of justice according to the law, and judges "do not discharge their responsibility depending on the presence of media in courtrooms", senior Supreme Court judge, Justice Kurian Joseph, said on Wednesday.

"(A) court's responsibility is administration of justice according to law, not how the society perceives it or what it expects from it. What the society sees or expects from the Constitution, that job is entrusted to people's representatives, and they will discharge it in Parliament. The responsibility that the court fulfill is what the Constitution or laws say," he said at an event to release a book in Malayalam on media freedom by Kerala-based lawyerjournalist Sebastian Paul here.

Taking a dig at some judges speaking too much in court rooms. Justice Joseph said that he had pointed out at an event in Kozhikode that one should not speak for "breaking news". He said, "It was a dear indication of the limits that a court has to observe. Since it will be misunderstood if I say that some courts get more enthusiastic if they sense the presence

of media, I will not say that." Pointing out a line in the book's introduction -- "darkness will spread in courtrooms if there is no media" -- Justice Joseph said he has a "slight difference of opinion". It is not because of media that there is light in courtrooms but it is a reality that the media further illuminates the brightness of courtrooms, he said

The SC judge said, "In the

Justice Kurian Joseph

NJAC judgment I have stated (that) what the Constitution is for the court to say. But what Constitutional aspiration should be is for people to say - for people's representatives, Parliament to say. (Because) what the Constitution should be is an expectation of people. It is regarding this that there should be discussions, formulation of policies and laws. But it is the court's responsibility to say what the Constitution is by interpreting it. That is the light of the court. That is not dependent on any presence or absence.'

Maintaining that the media and the judiciary are not competitors who should fight each other and prove who is weaker, he said, "Both are watchdogs of democracy. It is for both sides to introspect whether they should bark and bite each other, or forget their differences, discharge their duties

and protect democracy." Referring to the tussle between mediapersons and lawyers in Kerala High Court in 2016, Justice Joseph recalled that he while serving in the HC, he had held a media seminar in the court and wondered what had happened to the bond between the two professions. At one stage, he said, he advised "ceasefire" to both sides. "But to be honest, judiciary ceased fire, the media did not - the media continued (to) fire," he said, "I am not criticising anyone but maybe the fight could not be resolved because the firing continued in this man-

OPPOSITION LEADERS used adjectives like "intolerant" and "arrogant" to launch an attack on the government during the discussion on the motion: Thanks to the President's Speech Wednesday.

Congress deputy leader Anand Sharma alleged there was a big scam in the Rafale deal as the price at which the planes were negotiated were four times higher and benefited private firms. "You can definitely rope in private sector but you cannot compromise country's defence security.... You give entire deal to a private entity," he asked.

Sharma said the Modi government scrapped the 2005 deal signed during the UPA regime for purchase of 126 jets at a rate of Rs 526 crore each and inked a fresh pact in 2015 to purchase 36 jets at a much higher rate of Rs 15,070 crore each. Sharma said, "The Presidential address did not have anything on foreign policy or problems with China, the situation in Nepal or Maldives, but just mentioned old schemes without talking about the ground reality."

Hitting back at BJP President Amit Shah, who had said that Congress left nothing in heritage to the current government, Sharma highlighted steps taken by former Prime Ministers Jawarharlal Nehru, Indira

Gandhi, Rajiv Gandhi and Manmohan Singh, "The country has so many achievements. You say nothing has been done. This is showing disrespect to history and leaders," he said. Earlier, senior Congress leader

Ahmed Patel said, "In 2004, when the Vajpayee government left office, annual percapita income was Rs 24,000. In 2014, when the Manmohan Singh-led government ended its term, this had risen to Rs 70,000. In contrast, the debt during the NDA rule has risen. It was clear who is digging potholes."

Patel said, "The BJP will be defeated in 2019 as everyone including farmers are worried. The Union Budget, on which the government had pinned its hopes, has turned out to be a flop. Not just the opposition, but BJP allies like the Shiv Sena, Telugu Desam or the Shiromani Akali Dal did not seem to agree with the rosy projections being

CPI leader D Raja said the government has been working against the political democracy in the country and deepened the social inequality through its policy of "divide and misrule." He said the nation was passing through a very critical period and there was all-pervasive crisis in economic, political, social and cultural life and in the organs of the state including judi-

BJP's OBC wing chief in Kota writes to Shah: Replace Raje

THE HEAD of Bharatiya Janata Party's OBC wing in Kota district has written to party president Amit Shah seeking that Rajasthan Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje and state party chief Ashok Parnami be replaced ahead of the

state assembly polls due this year. The BJP lost two Lok Sabha seats and one Assembly seat in the recently held bypolls in Rajasthan, the results of which were declared on February 1. Choudhary wrote to Shah the

next day on his official letterhead, saying, "The people of the state are not happy with Chief Minister Vasundhra Raje's style of func tioning. The morale of party is waning due to her working style." Describing Parnami as a

"slave" of Raje, Choudhary said Parnami is damaging the organisation and is losing his grip on The ground-level party workers like him were well aware that the bypoll results would not go

in the saffron party's favour. Choudhary added.

Claiming that Raje had fallen into the bureaucracy "trap (IAS IPS, RAS, RPS)", he said the CM was leading the party on to a path that headed nowhere but towards defeat.

There was anger against the Raje government among all sections of the society, including the farmers, Choudhary said, adding that the general opinion among the BJP workers was that the state leadership should immediately be changed to infuse energy into the organisation.

Kota is known as a BIP bastion. The saffron party had lost in only one of the 17 seats in the district in the 2013 state Assembly polls. When contacted, Choudhary admitted that he had written the letter to Shah.

Contempt plea against Raje

Jaipur: Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)leader Poonam Chand Bhandari on Wednesday filed a contempt petition against Rajasthan Chief Minister Vasundhara Raje and Home Minister Gulab Chand Kataria, stating that they "undermined the authority of judiciary and (brought) disrepute" to the judiciary through their statements lastyear.

Maintaining that he had put forward the plight of the workers to the party's national head, he said, "Each and every word in the let-ter is that of the party workers."

Meanwhile, BJP MLA from Ramgarh in Alwar, Gyan Dev Ahuja, also questioned the gov-ernment in the Assembly over bribes by police, accusing Alwai SP Rahul Prakash of corruption. He asked how many policemen or officials were caught by the Anti-Corruption Bureau.
